In 2014, the Osteopathic Heritage Foundation and The Columbus Foundation joined resources and program interests to launch the Capital Improvement Funding Partnership. Recognizing the value of collaboration and the need for capital investments among nonprofits, the foundations committed to a funding partnership to support capital campaigns and projects designed to better serve vulnerable populations in Franklin County. The multi-year initiative will make available up to \$6 million to area nonprofits.

In the first year of the partnership, the foundations approved more than \$1.8 million in support to twenty-one (21) central Ohio nonprofit organizations working to address significant community issues, including homelessness and access to behavioral health care.

Demonstrating the value of philanthropic collaboration for achieving greater community impact, the first-year investments included:

- Over \$500,000 in allocations to organizations serving the Franklinton area, a socio-economically vulnerable neighborhood in Columbus.
- A total of \$455,000 combined support directed to organizations serving Franklin County's homeless population through emergency and long-term housing solutions.
- Expanded access to vital human services, ranging from oral health provision to intergenerational care for vulnerable children and older adults.
- Introduction of new services, including summer programs for children, a universally accessible playground and an integrated health clinic.

In 2015, combined capital investments made by the foundations totaled over \$1.6 million, supporting eighteen (18) organizations providing exceptional programs and services with an emphasis on those serving vulnerable populations.

The foundations are proud to recognize and celebrate the organizations receiving capital support through the funding partnership. We thank you for attending today and for sharing our collective commitment and passion for improving the quality of life in central Ohio.
